Kochii Eucalyptus

Kochii (pronounced "koh-chee-eye") Eucalyptus is produced from *Eucalyptus kochii*, which is native only to western Australia.

Kochii Eucalyptus contains the highest concentration of 1,8-cineole of any eucalyptus oil available in the market: 90–95%.

In July 2021, dōTERRA supported the planting of 10 new hectares with 10,000 eucalyptus seedlings! Eucalyptus kochii trees provide important land-care benefits to the region, and the entire oil production process retains a negative carbon footprint from beginning to end.

Lemon Eucalyptus

Also known as lemon-scented gum, Lemon Eucalyptus essential oil comes from *Eucalyptus citriodora*. Though originally native to northern Australia, we grow our plants in Kenya, where it thrives equally well!

All our lemon eucalyptus plants are grown with outgrowers through the Lunga Lunga project. We currently have 376 farmers growing lemon eucalyptus on approximately 130 acres. We've already planted 700,000 trees, with plans to reach five million!






dōTERRA Healing Hands Foundation®

The dōTERRA Healing Hand Foundation has funded numerous projects in Kenya:

- The construction of additional classroom and restroom facilities at Kiwegu Primary School
- Construction of a school library, water storage, staffroom, restrooms, teacher living quarters, and student veranda at Mwamose Primary school (as well as scholarship support)
- The construction of Mwena River Bridge, which allows river-crossing access for community and school children
- Construction of Majengo Mapya Kindergarten school
- Construction of a community center
- TICAH—indigenous culture and health trainings for 2,000 school children

- Colobus Conservation—education and reforestation of indigenous trees
- Mwamose Water Point, which is a community borehole and water tower
- The Water Maintenance Trust Fund, which does ongoing research and maintenance of community water sources

Along with donations from dōTERRA Healing Hands Foundation, we've established a community development fund in Kenya. For every kilogram of essential oil produced by its farmer cooperatives, a portion of revenue is set aside for a fund, overseen by the cooperatives themselves to finance larger development projects at their discretion.
