We fight modern slavery and victimization with our Hope action plan.



We raised **\$60,000** at convention to help fund a mobile crime lab for Oregon police. In October, we presented the funds to the Medford Police Department. They intend to deploy the mobile lab this December. The lab will combat child exploitation and human trafficking in southern Oregon.

Mobile crime labs empower officers to immediately prevent predatory threats from harming children. Thank you to everyone who made this lab possible!





Cō-Impact Sourcing®

We're making a positive difference in the lives of farmers and harvesters.

In 2021, **\$207,000** helped fund two health posts in Nepal. One of those clinics, the community health unit in Bhimfedi, was completed in September, 2022 and is now benefitting 5,000 people in Wintergreen sourcing areas.

This quarter, international markets stepped up to impact sourcing communities with help from the Cō-Impact Sourcing team Look at what they've accomplished!

China Market

- The Chitlang health post in Nepal Committed funding: \$375,000 (over three years) Actual funding: \$150,000
- Implementation partner: **CHOICE Humanitarian 1,200 households** now have access to healthcare through the Chitlang health post in rural Nepal.

Europe Market

- Gözler Village School Renovation Project Actual funding: \$75,000 Implementation partner: **EFECAN**
- The renovation of the once-closed Gözler Village grade school in Turkey is now open again for its students and staff thanks to Europe Market contributions.

Australia Market

- Hagar animal bank program in Vietnam Committed funding: \$66,365 Actual funding: \$33,719
- Implementation partner: Hagar The animal bank provides young women with animal husbandry training through
 Vietnam's Agriculture Ministry. This program helps fight human trafficking by giving women practical skills they can use
 to be self-sufficient.

Impact Story

Khadija Hassan Jamah is a mother of four from the remote village of Shumax Shumax—approximately 25 miles from Erigavo City. When she was nine, she fell and sustained soft tissue damage on her left arm. She went to a village healer, who dressed the wounds with herbs and cloth. But the wound never healed, and the damaged tissue deformed further, developing into a tumor.

The tumor became so large Khadija couldn't flex her hand. Any touch was excruciating, making it difficult to care for her children. Her family went to Manhal Hospital in Erigavo City, but the proposed procedure was too expensive.

Shortly after returning home, the Jamah family learned about the Sanaag Specialty Hospital. Khadija reached out, and the hospital admitted her, operating immediately. The tumor was safely removed, and Khadija is undergoing physiotherapy to redevelop full hand function, happy for her brighter future.

Impact Story

Project: The New Horizons Reforestation Effort

Advocate: Reed Gregory

Implementing Partner: New Horizons Foundation, Inc.

Location: Kenya

Impact: 400 community members, 15 churches, and 5 schools

Cost: \$4,290

Droughts and famines—resulting in devastating hunger and starvation—have escalated levels of poverty in Sub-Saharan Africa, which is why planting trees has become critical to the region's future. Doing so offers the most cost-effective way for rural households to build income and assets. Trees in Kenya also provide a measure of food security.

Kenya Orphan Support and doTERRA have partnered to help the rural community around Dimmock School—located in an arid district of eastern Kenya—plant more than 2,500 saplings to promote forest regrowth in the region. The project educated the community and its members about the importance of planting trees and the danger of cutting them down without replacing them.



The Ukraine Refugee Support

With the combined efforts of the Europe market, dōTERRA Healing Hands, and Wellness Advocates, \$188,793 was raised in Q3 to support Ukraine refugees fleeing conflict.

2022 Q3

Ukraine Projects

- > \$30,107 donated to provide evacuation transportation for vulnerable families and children near combat zones
- > 25 families with special needs members provided with safe shelter through the renovation of a derelict building
- >80 Ukrainian women empowered with hairstyling skills, crucial business education, and self-reliance tools to better their financial situations
- > 500 families provided with school provisions and bomb shelter supplies
- >80 Ukrainian women trained to make traditional Ukrainian clothing to be sold online



Australia/New Zealand

- **> 8** community canoes were donated to the indigenous people of the Pelican Narrows by True North Aid.
- 40 homes were checked for safety and housing code standards.

Taiwan

- **> 450** students attended afterschool classes at the Hang Chun Hospital.
- > 177 social workers and families attended equal opportunity classes through the Social Workers Assistance Program.

Japan

> \$30,655 was donated by dōTERRA Japan to Inagi, an organization that helps people with disabilities gain workplace skills.
