The doTERRA® Japan, Europe, Australia, and Canada markets all worked closely with Co-Impact Sourcing in Q4 to implement incredible projects.

Impact Story

In Lunga Lunga, Kenya, water scarcity is a constant threat to the local farmers and their families. These farmers plant and harvest the tea tree and lemon eucalyptus plant parts used to make the essential oils we know and love. At Mwamose Primary School, where many Kutoka Ardhini farmers send their children, there's currently no access to clean water. With direction from Fairoils Charitable Trust, dōTERRA Europe has funded a reverse osmosis water system that will provide 1,250 students and staff with clean, drinkable water. Fairoils has also partnered with a local rural water company to ensure this water system is maintained and operational for years to come.

Esseterre, in partnership with dōTERRA Europe, has funded a mentorship program for a foster family center in Dobrich, Bulgaria. dōTERRA sources Yarrow, Lavender, Melissa, Rose, and Summer Savory in Bulgaria, so it's a critical region to give back to. The center provides children under




18 with mentors who help with school materials and social development. The mentorship program promotes daily contact with activities to stimulate learning while having fun. The program will sponsor 39 children, helping them gain self-confidence and motivation.

Impact Story

Fuad Sicid Jamah is a two-year-old boy from Banadir—a village on the outskirts of Erigavo City. As his mother prepared breakfast one morning, Fuad bumped into the heated kettle, spilling boiling water all over himself. Fuad's panicked mother rushed him to the Sanaag Specialty Hospital for emergency treatment.

Fuad was immediately admitted and diagnosed, with burns covering 26% of his body. The burns affected his abdomen, back, and lower extremities. Hospital staff saved Fuad's life by cleaning his wounds and providing antibiotics, topical ointments, and IV fluids. Fuad responded well and is almost back to normal!

Cost: \$14,060

Families who come to Eva's Place are fleeing domestic violence, sexual assault, or homelessness. Most people arrive with few possessions, and the children are often scared, confused, and upset. Eva's Place provides shelter to the vulnerable until they can get back on their feet. The Eva's Place Playground Renovation project will provide a space for kids to play while parents relax. The playground will benefit 100 women and children each year.

Law Enforcement Training

law enforcement trainings held (Georgia & Utah) 43 specialized law enforcement officers trained The mobile crime lab funded at doTERRA Connection 2022 | Heal and pole cameras were donated to the Medford Police Department. Over \$26,000 of doTERRA products were donated to five anti-human trafficking events.

hope

In November 2022, the Hope action plan and Stirling Foundation collaborated with Utah law enforcement administrators and leaders to suppor those experiencing trauma after investigating child exploitation crimes. Child exploitation cases are emotionally difficult to investigate, so a recent workshop explored mental and emotional health resources to help officers stay at the top of their abilities while they shut down predators.

Mental health specialists and Wellness Advocates presented on coping mechanisms for trauma, depression, and anxiety, raising awareness for law enforcement mental health. Local officers also participated in animal-assisted therapy to create a calm, stress-free environment. The Hope action plan will offer additional workshops in 2023 for frontline officers fighting human trafficking and victimization.

The Ukraine Effort

To aid Ukrainian refugees, the dōTERRA Healing Hands Foundation® and Wellness Advocates raised **\$112,071** and dōTERRA Japan and Europe raised **\$41,062** in Q4.

Total To Date

- > \$1,122,970 raised for Ukrainian refugee aid in 2022
- > 106,942 refugees supported
- > 10 countries supported

Ukraine Projects

- > dōTERRA Europe financed a project to provide food, clothing, and other necessities to Ukrainians.
- > \$35,000 went toward three to five cars (based on availability and cost) to transport refugees away from Ukraine's hot borders.
- › dōTERRA Japan provided soap and dōTERRA spa Rose Hand Lotion to 361 Ukrainian refugees living in need.

Canada

The doTERRA Canada market donated \$17,684 to support Nova Scotia hurricane victims and children aging out of foster care.

Europe

> The doTERRA Europe market donated \$35,000 to provide a truck that'll supply over 1,000 Syrian refugees with daily food.

Australia

> The dōTERRA Australia market donated \$3,254 to support distressed women and local First Nation children, positively impacting 552 women and children.

Hong Kong

The doTERRA Hong Kong market donated \$4,310 to four organizations like Dialogue in the Dark, which helps elderly, injured, and handicapped individuals. 570 people were impacted by their donations.

Taiwan

The dotERRA Taiwan market impacted 198 people through the Social Workers Assistance Program, which helps traumatized families and children get back on their feet.

China

> The doTERRA China market donated \$25,870 to the Children with Major Disease Project, which treats kids with diseases like intractable epilepsy, acute lymphoblastic leukemia, eosinophilia, and thalassemia. 7 children received aid.

Japan

> The doTERRA Japan market donated over \$112,180 to help special needs and physically challenged people find employment and belonging, gave over 9,000 pounds of food to a local food pantry, and delivered Christmas toys to children at local orphanages, directly impacting 985 people.

Korea

> The dōTERRA Korea market donated \$8,078 to Sun-Up Ville, delivering products and 440 pounds of kimchi—a traditional Korean food—to the residents of the ville. Local Wellness Advocates also ran an essential oils class for the residents, impacting 52 people.
